VALES POINT SOLAR PROJECT

Delta is pleased to announce that it has commenced the planning process for a solar power station at Vales Point. The project plans to use the rehabilitated areas of the existing ash dam to produce up to 45 MW of solar power, which is enough to provide electricity for 15,000 homes.

Delta is currently preparing the environmental assessment which will include studies of heritage, land and water, visual impacts and traffic management. These assessments are expected to be submitted to NSW Planning before the end of the year. The project construction and operation is expected to have minimal impact on the community and local environment, and has the potential for supporting 100 construction job and 5 full time jobs over the 25 year project life.

The project is classified as a State Significant Development and will require development approval from the NSW Minister for Planning. Delta is interested in community input to the approvals process and will look to provide further information and opportunity for comment in the coming months. MESSAGE FROM MANAGING DIRECTOR



Welcome to the Delta's Community Newsletter.

It has been another successful year for Delta and I want to acknowledge our dedicated employees in maintaining the reliability of our Vales Point plant.

During this year our Outage Project Team has carried out two outages. In April, a three-week maintenance outage was completed on Unit 6 and in August a similar minor outage was completed on Unit 5. Both these projects improve the reliability of the plant and ensure ongoing high availability for the power station.

Delta is also investing heavily in the future of Vales Point with over \$20 million committed to a number of projects that will see the power station operating through to at least 2029.

In the past year Delta has also been investigating acquisitions or development opportunities which support the reliability of electricity

supply and sustains high quality jobs in Australia. This includes opportunities for conventional plant and in the renewable energy sector.

Delta supports an orderly transition to a low carbon future which also ensures a reliable supply of base load power.

Delta has development plans for a 45MW solar facility on a rehabilitated parcel of land at the Vales Point power station and is also exploring options for pumped hydro electricity in South Australia. This is not

about picking one technology over another, but ensuring that business and household consumers can have certainty of supply.

BUSHFIRE REGENERATION PROJECT

Delta has commenced works to remediate the area adjacent to the Pacific Highway damaged by a severe bushfire in 2013, followed by stormwater ponding soon after.

Delta has prioritised rehabilitation of this area to improve the visual amenity of the site.

Works completed to date include:

- i. Stage 1 Drainage improvement works and construction of berm wall. This work included the planting of 170 native vegetation tube stock along the top of the wall.
- ii. Stage 2 Planting of 35 mature native trees sourced from a local nursery at Munmorah.
- iii. Stage 3 Planting of a mixed native grass and shrub understorey with 1200 tube stock and 100 larger tree plants.

Delta has utilised in-house resources as well as our civil contractor, Toveety, and engaged a rehabilitation specialist group, Total Earthcare, to complete the work.

Delta has committed approximately \$50,000 for the civil works and plantings and ongoing work will include care and maintenance activities such as watering, mulching and weed control.

Delta will continue to monitor the area for revegetation success over time. For more information on Delta projects please visit <u>www.de.com.au</u>
